BOARD ACTIONS

Linda Slack

The following motions were presented to the Board at the February 26, 2008 Board of Directors meeting.

1. The Board unanimously approved the minutes of the November 27, 2008 meeting.

2. The first sentence of Section 3.05 of the Development Standards and Architectural Requirements concerning Working Hours states: "Construction vehicles and Non-emergency outside service personnel such as landscaping contractors and construction trades are not permitted in Deer Creek on Sundays or holidays." However the list of holidays is not defined. The board approved, by a majority of 7 in favor and 1 opposed, to adopt the 10 Federal Holidays as the Deer Creek official holiday list. These holidays are New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. A. During the discussion, there was a motion made to remove Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Columbus Day and Veterans Day from the official Deer Creek holiday list. That motion did not receive a second and was dropped.

3. A motion was unanimously passed to approve an expenditure of up to \$2,500 to be charged to the reserve fund to install pavers at the guard parking area that would be large enough for a guard's vehicle, golf cart, and boat.

4. There was unanimous approval for the following Committee Chairpersons to serve in 2008.

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

The Communications Committee met on Thursday, February 7th. In attendance were: Isabella DeJohn, Jim Farnum, Ron Meijer, Candi Messerschmidt, Linda Slack, Clark Southworth, Diane Weeghman, and Jack Sullivan.

1. We discussed the current process for publication of *The Trails* and the transition of the publication process from Clark Southworth to Jim Farnum. Jim provided samples and information on a new format and a new printer he is going to use. This printer offers very good quality at a much lower price. (The current printing cost is approximately \$300 - 500 per issue. The new printer has quoted a price of less than half that amount while still maintaining our expected high quality.)
2. We will add a January 2009 *Trails*. This will offer one more opportunity to provide information on candidates running for the Board and enable us to remind residents of any amendments to be voted upon. (We were disappointed with the small number of homeowners who voted this year.) The cost of this additional issue will be offset by the lower price offered by our new vendor.
3. Clark Southworth proposed we purchase Adobe Acrobat 8 Professional software at a cost of \$385 to allow Clark to create interactive forms that would be placed on our web site. Interactive forms would allow homeowners to go to our web site to fill out and/or print Deer Creek forms. At this time the proposal for this purchase is on hold. Jim Farnum uses the software in his business and will see if he can create the forms.
4. The Communications Committee, in conjunction with the Board, Committee members and a team of tireless volunteers are working hard to "Get out the Vote". Judy Brinker will discuss the calling and door-to-door campaign. On our annual ballot, there was an amendment to the Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions. This amendment states that any homeowner's petition to change our documents must have resident signatures within 180 days of the date the petition began. Also, after 180 days the petition cannot be started again for 2 years. If you did not have an opportunity to vote in January, one of our volunteers will be calling you soon.

LAKES, WATERWAYS & ANIMALS

Chuck from Aquagenix sprayed all 17 lakes for algae. Actually there was very little algae in the lakes. However, Chuck did say certain properties along the lakes showed a small algae problem and that he assumed those properties had been treated with fertilizer in the recent past.



We are having a problem with Lake 1-6 as the pipeline taking water from the trunk canal into Lake 1-6 is plugged. Clark Southworth has been working on this problem and has not been able to correct the situation. This is about a 100' long pipe, and we may have to lay a new pipe in order to get water in to Lake 1-6.

The water level in all the other 16 lakes is at the designed level.

Roads



Two potholes were repaired by the Streets and Structures Committee on Deer Creek Boulevard. A contractor is scheduled to sweep our streets in the near future.

Street Lights

Members of the Streets and Structures Committee surveyed the Deer Creek community and discovered three street lights not functioning properly. Committee members made repairs by installing new bulbs and photo-electric cells in street lights located on White Egret Lane and Deer Trail Boulevard.

Gates

The exit gate at the Woodbriar gatehouse recently failed to open and close properly. A security firm was contacted and repairs were made to a loop switch. In order to prevent water contamination, Sarasota County has directed that a backflow valve be installed at the McIntosh gate.



LANDSCAPE / IRRIGATION COMMITTEE

There are two main projects scheduled for 2008:

A] Obtaining proposals:

1. To remove dead Eleagnus along McIntosh Rd. from the bridge to the northern border of the Villas and replace with Viburnum

2. For new irrigation for this site in the form of a drip line. County approval is needed for extended watering of this site

B] The last phase of replacing plants along Central Sarasota Pkwy. wall and adding sod where necessary. County approval is also needed to extend watering.

RULES & REGULATIONS COMMITTEE

The Deer Creek documents state that a home may not be rented or leased more than twice in any calendar year and any rental or lease agreement shall provide for a term of at least six months. The owner is responsible for compliance with the restriction. An owner engaging a rental agency or placing an ad for a rental should make sure that all parties are aware of the restriction.

The Architectural Standards prohibit service and construction work on Sundays and holidays. Heretofore there has been no definition of a holiday in the documents. At the recent Board meeting a list of official holidays was approved. They are the published Federal holidays, which are: New Year's Day, M.L. King Day, President's Day (Washington's Birthday), Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. As provided in the documents, exceptions may be granted by the Traffic Committee chair (Jay Olin), or a Board member.

Assessment Reminder

Payments must be received within 30 days of the due date to avoid a late charge of \$25 plus interest and other costs.

For your convenience, sign up for automatic payment whereby your bank, at no charge to you, sends in the exact amount each quarter.

TRAFFIC COMMITTEE

The new and enhanced Woodbriar Gate security camera system has been installed, tested and is now fully functional. We now have the capability of capturing vehicle license plate numbers on all entering vehicles and a new camera will monitor pedestrian traffic entering or leaving through the pedestrian gate. Training on the new system has been completed for most of the Traffic Committee members with the training of all members to be completed before the end of February. The attention has now shifted to evaluating the audio and video specifications needed to support the activities of the security guards manning the Main Gate. A proposal is expected to be ready for submission to the Board for the March meeting.



Guard service personnel changes which occurred during February, were solely initiated by Wackenhut and we are monitoring the performance of the new personnel. These changes must be expected, but we hope that they will be minimized so the guards become familiar with the Deer Creek residents.

DESIGN & DEVELOPMENT

In accordance with Deer Creek Development Standards and Architectural Requirements (now posted on

the Deer Creek Web Site: (www.deercreeksarasota.org), approval from the Design and Development Board is required before any changes are made to the appearance of the exterior of any home in our community. This includes painting the exterior, installing a new roof, as well as any additions or removals from the property (e.g. trees, shrubs, decorative items, etc). We only list approved requests, not those that have been denied. The following covers D&D activities through February 23, 2008.

8383 Cypress Hollow Dr. -

Approved replacing tile roof with similar color.

4544 Longspur Ln. -

Approved removal of dying palm tree. No replacement required.

8639 Woodbriar Dr. -

Approved installation of TV antenna in position not to be seen from street.

4531 Eagle Ridge Ln. -

Approved painting house same color as before.

8583 Woodbriar Dr. -

Approved removal of dead plants and replacement with like specimens.

8475 Woodbriar Dr. -

Approved removal replacement of shrubs killed by the frost.

8254 Cypress Hollow Dr. -

Approved enlargement of landscape area using same types of materials as already in place.

Approved pressure cleaning and resealing of driveway.

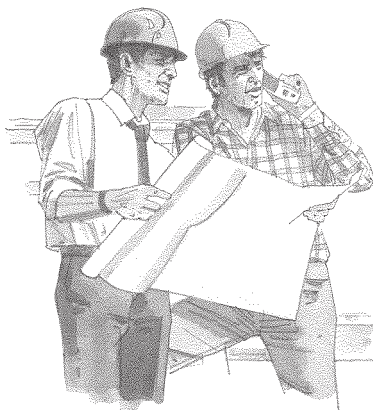
